NEW PRINCIPAL AT POOL HAYES

Mr Baker added: "I am delighted to take on the role of Principal at Pool Hayes Academy and, whilst continuing the excellent work that has already been done, I know there are so many more things we can work on to improve further. I am looking forward to the challenge and to making our academy the outstanding local choice."

What a year for Pool Hayes. Starting with our best OFSTED outcomes to date, in which Personal Development, Behaviour & Welfare, Leadership & Management and 16-19 ere all rated as 'Good', the pupils have continued to flourish and show exactly what they are capable of.

You will also be aware that we have now switched from Pool Hayes School to Pool Hayes Academy and our partnership with the Academy Transformation Trust (ATT) is only strengthening our commitment to transform the academy and achieve the best possible standards.

Our staff are enjoying the extra support, training, input and challenge provided by the ATT team and we even saw Miss Williams and

Mr Harris win national recognition at the ATT Staff Awards event which was a wonderful achievement for them and the wider academy.

In addition, with summer building work being part funded by the organisation, there will be even better facilities for our community and current parents will be pleased to see that the fantastic refurbishment programme which has revolutionised facilities is continuing.

The Summer Term is clearly the business-end of things with the Y11-Y13 students having put in a tremendous amount of work in preparation for their final exams. The exams went as well as we could have hoped and everything is crossed that the surge in results we enjoyed last summer will be replicated this year. Indeed, many of the vocational results have already come in and they have only improved from last year; no mean feat when many of our courses hit top marks last year - with Level 3 Creative Technology coming in as the second highest achieving course nationally.

Our local community work has carried on at a great pace and each of our five Houses have been fund-raising for their local charities. We have seen Own Clothes' Days, ice-cream and cake sales, jewellery sales, and even sponge- the-teacher events! All in all, local charities will receive over £3,000 by the end of this term.

Elsewhere, we have been working hard with local primary schools and it has been fantastic to see youngsters visit our academy to handle weird and wonderful animals from the Exotic Zoo and to see the superb performances of 'Billy Elliot' that played to packed houses across three nights. We have also led the way in setting up a secondary partnership body with West Midlands Police to support local families and have benefited from the local fire brigade and army regiments coming in to work with students.

Ando so to next year... Matt Allman, the Principal since January 2014, will be leaving us at the end of this year to take over the reins of a school hearer to his home. However, as I take on the role of Principal, I know that my job is made so much easier thanks to the tremendous support I am given by our caring and supportive parents, our exceptional staff and out amazing pupils. This year has been great. I can't wait for the next one.

The mammoth 26hr journey was all worthwhile when students and staff arrived at the fantastic skiing resort in Andorra. PSHEE - RELATIONSHIPS

Our PSHEE programme provides the advice needed to prepare students for the day-today challenges of life with topics ranging from drugs awareness to e-safety and sex education to economic competency. Recently, Year 7 and Year 9 undertook work on dealing with 'Relationships' so that they would be better equipped to forge their own as they proceed through their life. They focused on good / bad signs in relationships and how to better equip themselves to build better ties with others. They were trained to spot risks, de-escalate conflict, informed on where to go for advice, and faced problem-solving challenges which saw them acting as parents.



FLIP OUT

Rewards play a big part in life at Pool Hayes and celebrating students who do the right things every day is a big priority. The Top 25 students - judged on achievement, attendance and behaviour - from each of the five Houses were invited on a rewards trip that literally turned them upside down! 'Flip Out' is located in Stone and has numerous trampolines so that students can go wild - whilst kept safe and secure. The teachers showed their skills too though Mr Mallott's veteran status lessened his mobility - but the students were the ones that shone. Well done to all that attended!



ART EXHIBITION

The annual Art Exhibitions are always a huge source of pride in the academy and this year was no exception. The Y13s previewed their work in the newly refurbished library and themes ranged from 'Alice in Wonderland' to self-identity. The work was on sale, with profits going onto fund further projects and education and attendees included, students, staff, parents and other community stakeholders. The Art results in the academy have been on a continual path of improvement and all the evidence on display in this event suggest the trend is only going upwards.



SCIENCE AT UNIVERSITY

Our Science Club attended the Salter's Festival of Chemistry at the University of Birmingham this term. Our representatives got to work in the world-leading Chemistry Department with resident undergraduates and completed a series of scientific challenges which tested this subject knowledge and scientific skills. These challenges ranged from CSI style detective skills to chromatography, and from acid and alkali testing to handling mystery chemicals. This university visit was just one strand of our extensive Aim Higher programme.



DUKE OF EDINBURGH

Students recently completed their First Expedition in pursuing their Bronze Award as our DofE programme took off this term. The Y10 students undertook a gruelling journey across Cannock Chase braving the elements - and we are talking serious sleet, hail and rain! Our two groups were last to depart on the mission but were the first to reach the destination which was testament to their perseverance, commitment and team spirit. Ms Sheridan took the plaudits for setting up the programme and, alongside the Principal Mr Allman, attended an awards ceremony at Buckingham Palace.



FIRE CADET HEROES

Our Learning Hub set up a superb fire cadet package for five Y10 students and all successfully passed their fire cadet training despite facing a lengthy and intensive programme which stretched over multiple evenings and weekends. The course finished with a practical task, a parade and a mayoral presentation and our students were commended by local dignitaries and fire service leaders. The event was attended by parents and staff who were all bursting with pride. Indeed, some of our students were asked to re-engage with the programme to act as mentors and coaches for younger students coming through the ranks. This programme only adds to the range of activities connected to our highly-praised Learning Hub.



BRITISH ARMY VISIT

On Tuesday 28th June the British Army came to Pool Hayes Academy to put the Leaning Hub students through a day of challenging activities and team building exercises. The day was a great success with students taking part on a typical Army PT session, experiencing life outdoors in camouflage, cooking and tasting their rationed food and challenges on the Climbing Wall. The commitment and resilience shown by the students has resulted in them being extended a formal invitation to visit Staffordshire barracks for a day so that they can further develop their skills. This event is only part of a wider package of events designed to stretch and challenge the wider life skills of our students.



YEAR 12 FUTURES WEEK

Our Excellent Year 12 Futures Week entered its second year and built upon the superb provision of its inaugural year. The motivational speakers and guests from a range of university and apprenticeship providers made sure our students were left with a clear sense of direction for the future. In addition, the 'Dragon's Den' challenge saw fierce competition and student feedback was resoundingly positive. The programme added to the events through the year that have included the Aim Higher Evenings, the Staffordshire University Battle Bus and National Careers Week and is one of several reasons the academy was this year awarded with our highly-prized accreditation for our excellent CEIAG provision.



YEAR 11 PROM

Every year the Prom seems to get bigger and better-and this year was no exception. It was a night of glamour dresses, fake tan, sharp suits and parents looking at empty wallets as the passing out parade of all passing out parades took place. Sixth Form Results Day starts on the morning of Thursday 18th August and will start the rustle of envelopes, the trepidation of viewing certificates and will decide the destination of our star students as they move on from our academy. The university process is particularly hectic at this time so the support of our Careers Advisors and senior staff can be all-important in securing that last-minute place or snatching that course upgrade.



YEAR 11 RESULTS

Year 11 Results Day starts on the morning of Thursday 25th August and in many ways represents the biggest day in the academy year as the future pathways of so many students are decided in one fell swoop. The result certificates will be given out in the Sixth Form Centre and teaching staff and Careers Advisors will be on hand to support students in getting onto their preferred pathway. Naturally, many of our students stay on in our excellent Sixth Form so there is often just a quick check on course grades ready for Y12 Induction at the start of September. The students and staff have given 100% so let's hope the summer brought success for as many people as possible.



2016-17 INDUCTION

The academy year will again start with our comprehensive induction programme for new Year 7 students and new Sixth Formers - with specific times and dates circulated to students and parents in advance of the return dates.
