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Remember the techniques and skills you have learnt in lessons and set high standards for your work.

- Copy any of the drawings on this worksheet as accurately as you can or use them as a starting point to make your own drawings using your imagination.
- Think about books you have read that have animals or creatures as the characters, think about the setting or background for them, are they realistic or imaginative? This can include picture books you may have enjoyed when you were younger such as The Gruffalo or The Very Hungry Caterpillar or could be books from our 18 by 18 list like The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe or His Dark Materials. If you can't think of any, do some research and read some books that have animals or creatures as their characters or heroes. You can get ideas from our reading list or from books you have at home.
- Create your own character for a book, it could be an animal, monster or other creature. Draw it and describe what it looks like and its personality.
- Use coloured pencils, paint, collage materials, card, fabric, clay, plasticene anything you have access to, to create your character using colour and experimenting with materials.
- Write your own story about your character and create the illustrations. Think about the quality of
 your written work (remember your CUPS and amazing adjectives and other exciting vocabulary)
 and the quality of your illustrations use high level skills and get inspired by the pictures below.
- Take photographs of views, spaces and landscapes you can see from your window or on any walks you go on. Be creative with viewpoints, think about backgrounds and if you can, you could edit the photos to make them more interesting and creative. Save different versions. Write about the changes you made and whether you think they were successful.
- Research any of the following illustrators: Sandra Dieckmann, Eric Carle, Maurice Sendak, Emily Gravett, Sara Fanelli, Shaun Tan, Chris Riddell or Isabelle Arsenault. Create a PowerPoint

presentation, poster or booklet including pictures and facts about their work. Be creative in your presentation.

• Create your own fashion designs inspired by animals, creatures, landscapes or your story. Label them to show what materials you would use if you could make them.
