

How to use your KO

Why is retrieval important?

- Retrieval is when we focus on getting information that we've already learned out of our heads
- The more we do it the less likely we are to forget
- It's REALLY important to space out our retrieval practice over the whole year
- It's also REALLY important to close our KOs when we're doing it - don't just copy it out

How to retrieve



Step One: Pick a subject and a topic. Don't forget by the end of the year there will be three booklets to choose from



Step Two: Use the suggested activities on the next page to retrieve a section of your KO



Step Three: Come back to it again over the next few days/weeks. When you can easily recall a section

Post its

Sketch it
