Knowledge Organisers

Pool Hayes Academy have been creating Knowledge Organisers for all year groups across all subjects as a key teaching and learning strategy to support students with the cognitive load of their subjects. Every student in the school has been provided with a Knowledge Organiser booklet which forms part of their non-negotiables for every lesson.

Students have received several virtual assemblies explaining the use of Knowledge Organisers in their lessons and how to successfully use them independently and staff have been using a range of techniques in lessons following successfully training at the beginning of the year.

As this is a new strategy, it was essential to gain both staff and student feedback on their use and implementation and feedback surveys were sent out to both groups. The feedback on this was very positive and students were clearly able to see the value in enhancing their own learning. Therefore, the students Spring Term Knowledge Organiser will be provided in a plastic popper pocket with their names on to ensure that the booklets are more durable and are less easily misplaced. Students in KS4 and KS5 will have personalised folders to store their subject Knowledge Organisers in to support them with revision and formative assessments.

As parents and carers we encourage you to support your child by revising with their Knowledge Organiser at home, to support them with homework and with summative assessments. It is essential that they bring these to the academy everyday to support their learning in the classroom.

Covid-19 Over Christmas
