Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this update finds you all in good health. We have welcomed our students back to school this fortnight following the half term break and it has been brilliant to see students in lessons and learning across the academy. As you are aware, Covid restrictions have now been moved to guidance as part of the government's 'Living with Covid strategy'. Although we all welcome the return of some form or normality after the last two years we still need to be vigilant and not become complacent. If your child has symptoms of Covid-19 we recommend they still take a PCR test and isolate in line with national guidelines. We will still provide TEAMS links for live lessons if this happens. The guidance on regular home lateral flow testing has changed and this is no longer required. However, we would ask that if your child has symptoms you still go for a PCR test and this can be via post. Face coverings are no longer compulsory however if your child wants to wear one this is acceptable.

## **World Book Day**

On Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March we marked World Book Day. This was a particularly special year for the event as it was its twenty fifth anniversary. To celebrate, the school held a number of competitions including design a book mark and guess the book in the suitcase. Many staff took the opportunity to dress up. It was great to see lessons being taught by Spanish Dictionaries, Musketeers and fairy tale characters. Meanwhile, in the library, students met Dr Frankenstein and his monster and were asked who the real monster was. During the week, assemblies challenged students to be reading our 18 by 18 booklist with Mr Lawrence reading short stories and extracts from The Book Thief. Students were also issued with a World Book Day Voucher which they can exchange for a World Book Day Book or for a discount on a book of their choice.

We were delighted to host Blakemore distribution recently at Pool Hayes, who gave a brilliant road safety demonstration on the dangers of lorries on our roads. All students in Year 7 learnt about blind spots, how to ride their bicycles and how to move around a parked lorry safely. 
### Mocks


