
Matilda Production














Swimming Pool Conversion

I am pleased to be able to share with you that work to renovate our empty swimming pool into a 'state of the art' auditorium starts next week. The project is scheduled to completed around mid-September and begins on Monday 23rd May. Many of you may remember the old swimming pool at Pool Hayes Academy, however, we cannot support a swimming pool due to spiralling costs. This conversion will enable us to have a multifunctional space that we can use for exams, assemblies, wet breaks and lunches and many other opportunities. Along with the conversion, we are also creating a huge covered area so that students will be sheltered from all elements during both the wet and sunny months. We are really looking forward to having both spaces available to use. We have spoken to all students this week about the importance of safety around the building. The site will be securely fenced off and all builders and contractors have had the full safety checks to enable them to work on a school site. Our students will not have access to the building site at all. If a student chooses to enter the building site, they will be dealt with severely in line with our consequence system. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

Exams Update

I am so proud of our Year 11, Year 12 and Year 13 students this week. They have fully committed to their exams and have been #PHAntastic in their application and resilience. Students have a hectic schedule in front of them – in particular the first week back after half term but they have made a strong start.
